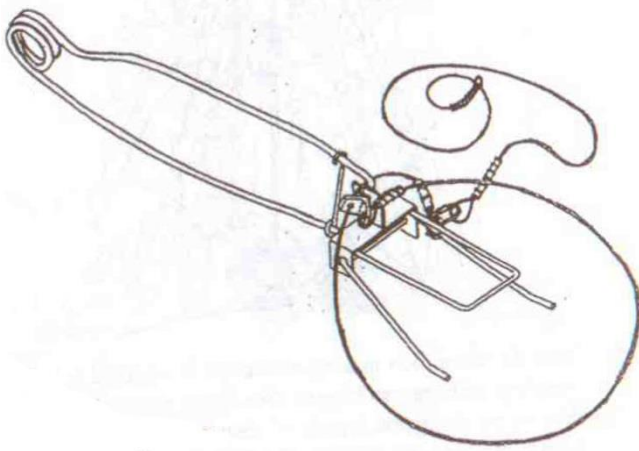


Fremont Hog Foot Snare Instruction Sheet

**USE EXTREME CAUTION WHEN SETTING
THE FREMONT SNARE THROWER!!**

TREATING THE SPRING

The spring and the snare assembly can be boiled in logwood dye or liquid trap dye.

Do **NOT** wax the trap!!

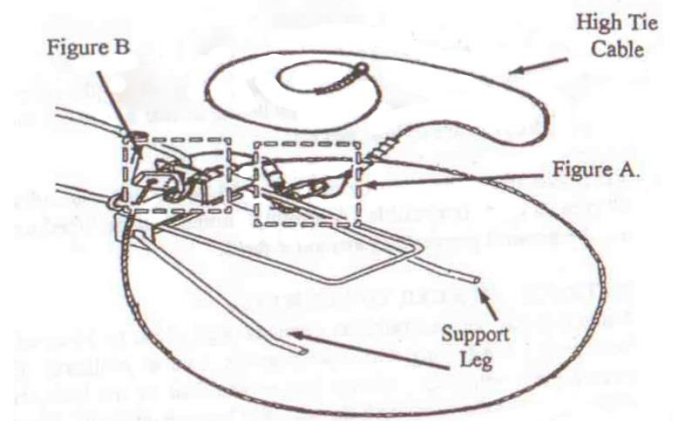
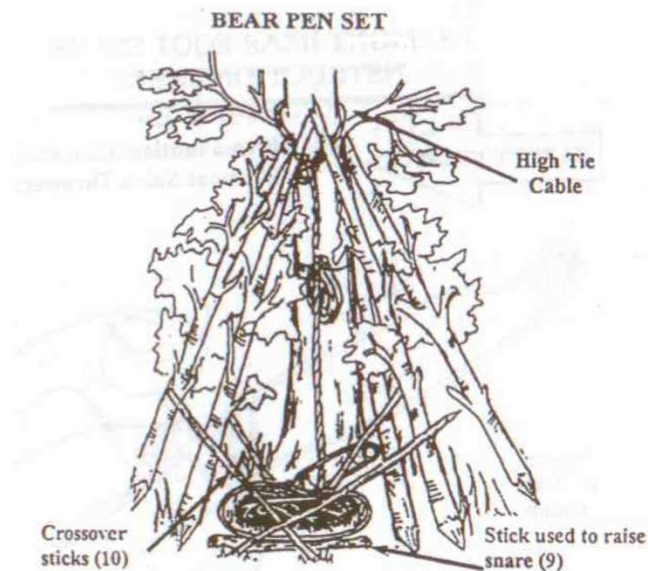
The spring and the snare assembly can be boiled in logwood dye or liquid trap dye. Do **NOT** wax the trap!!

SETTING THE FREMONT SNARE THROWER

1. Connect formed snare eye to formed eye on the high tie cable with heavy duty swivel.
2. Slip either one of the support legs of the thrower into the snare eye with the swivel. (Shown on figure A – back page) Work with the lay of the cable so the snare lays flat.
NOTE: After a catch is made, the snare eye pulls off the support leg, freeing the snared animal from the thrower.
3. Open the snare loop making sure the cable is engaged in the thrower eye along with the pan trigger. (See figure B-back page)
4. Prepare an elongated trench 4" deep for the spring and 4" deep by 8" in diameter for the pan area.
5. Place the thrower in the prepared trench and anchor the end of the high tie solidly to a tree or drag.
6. Set the thrower spring by pressing down the upper arm.
IMPORTANT – ENGAGE THE SAFETY HOOK!!
7. Engage the trigger by lifting up the pan.
8. Cover pan with 9" fiberglass trap pan cover, then cover lightly with debris.
9. Open the snare loop and place around the pan. Raise the snare about 2" above the pan using sticks.
10. PLEASE NOTE: You want the snare loop farthest from the thrower at least 2" above the pan. This will ensure that when the animal steps down on the pan, the snare loop is already fairly high on its leg. For colder climates - This also prevents the snare from freezing down after a snowfall.

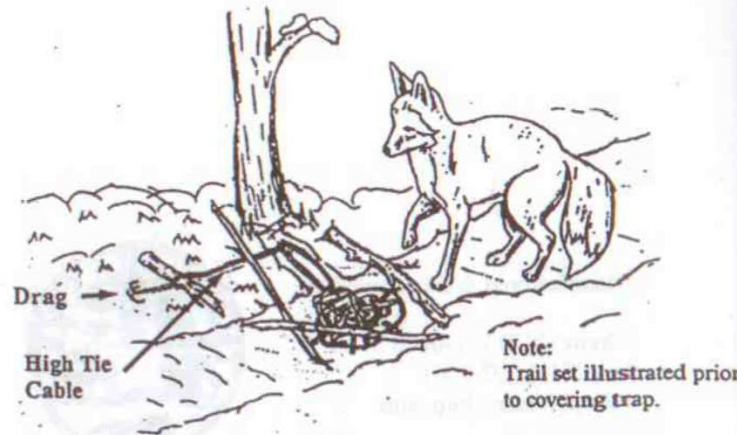
11. Carefully disengage the safety hook.
12. Finally a step over stick or crossed sticks may be placed on one or two sides of the set to guide the animal's foot onto the pan. (see picture of pen set)

TIP: If possible the high tie cable should be looped around a 6" tree as high as possible. A lunging animal will be lifted up off the ground preventing any solid jerks.



SETTING FOR WOLF AND COUGAR

Use the Fremont Bear Foot Snare with 1/8" Cable. The same setting instructions apply for bear. The high tie cable can be fastened to a drag. See illustration below.
